


The American Regions Math League (ARML) Goes Local!



What is it?

ARML Local is a contest held every spring at high schools. These schools host one or more teams of six students from each participating school. The contest format is similar to the national ARML competition, with short-answer Team, Individual, and Relay Rounds. Local contests will run on the same weekend and results will be aggregated nationwide so teams can see how they compare to schools in other regions.

To run ARML Local contests, we need ARML Local coordinators! Coordinators organize the local contests, bringing together volunteers and teams for a day of challenging, exciting mathematics. If you have not organized a contest before, don't worry. You will have the support of other coordinators through our discussion boards. High school math coaches, coordinate the contest with at least one other school and your school's first team is free (the fees are \$30 per team). College math clubs and math enrichment programs, reach out to your community to get talented math students interested in your program! Help spread ARML Local!
